To get started, you need:

- an adult coach from the school or community who has the desire and commitment to encourage youth fishing, meet with the Team monthly, and coordinate fishing opportunities.
- permission from your school principal to use the school's name and logo. (Exception: with 6 members, you could start a Community Club with a letter of denial from your principal.)
- a minimum of two interested students, grades 9–12, with an adult boat captain/coach to form a team. Younger students (9–14 years of age), may participate on a Junior Varsity or middle school level.
- all participating members need to join B.A.S.S. Nation and B.A.S.S. Nation Virginia by paying dues of \$30.* This will provide members with B.A.S.S. liability insurance, as well as subscriptions to *Bass Times* and *Bassmasters* magazines.
- to recruit members, elect officers, and write your by-laws (or use our suggested by-laws).
- to obtain fishing rods and tackle, learn basic knots, and take a basic boater safety class.
- to develop your club tournament schedule to coincide with the state schedule.

However, with at least six anglers, your school qualifies to have Club Teams that will fish competitively against its own members to determine the best fisherman for its six man team. Club Teams also compete against other Club Teams from other schools in local, state and national fishing tournaments.

All high school Teams and Club Teams enjoy team activities, camaraderie, and state-wide competitions. The B.A.S.S. program promotes environmental education, community service, and conservation. As part of the B.A.S.S. High School Nation, Virginia youth can compete in the three B.A.S.S. High School Nation State Tournaments and in the B.A.S.S. High School Nation National Opens and Championship.

Coaches are Team Assests

Coaches help scout out lakes and ponds for ideal bass habitats and help anglers decide on the best bait presentation for that anticipated catch of the day. Coaches may teach anglers how to read lake maps, how to comprehend boat electronics, and how to properly set up boat trolling motors. Coaches will provide and drive the bass boat. Coaches can be a family member, member of the community, or school staff. Coaches do not fish during state and national competitions.
