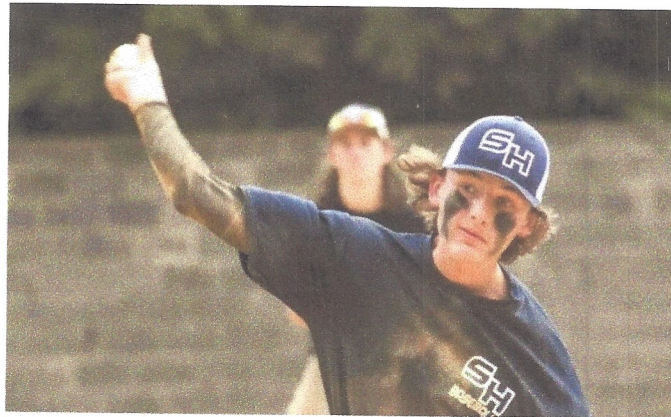

On March 23, 2023, Lucas Crutchfield, age 15, was involved in a baseball accident at school. While practicing, Lucas was hit with a hard-hit ball that took a bad hop and hit him in the left temple. Since then, treatment of the injury caused Lucas to have two emergency room visits, two CT scans, one MRI, is currently seeing his fifth specialist in Richmond, VA and a team of doctors in Pittsburgh, PA. Lucas has suffered a concussion/traumatic brain injury with severe amnesia.

From appearance, Lucas looks well. If you were to have a conversation with him, you would realize his cognitive ability has been severely impacted. Due to the hard hit to Lucas's temple, his hippocampus was moved and inverted. The hippocampus is in the temporal lobe of the brain and controls your memory and learning; hence why Lucas has experienced memory loss. In addition, he has some ventricles that have enlarged which show signs of tissue damage. As of now, Lucas is currently unable to stay alone, go to school, or receive homebound instruction. He still experiences constant headaches, vision issues, hearing loss, and some cognitive deficiencies. Seeing him go through this is simply heartbreaking.

Lucas is very athletic and loves being outdoors. He loves playing baseball, especially at Parker Park. You would always see him with a smile on his face and that uniform on ready to play! He also enjoys hunting, fishing, and working outside. Thankfully, through this whole ordeal, he has not lost his sense of humor! Fortunately, he is still able to go fishing.

Lucas is the son of Ryan and Crystal Crutchfield. He is the oldest of three boys, younger brothers being Tyler and Mason Crutchfield. These fundraising efforts will be used to help with medical expenses, therapies, travel expenses, and support for The Crutchfield Family during his road to recovery.
