Dredging Meeting Claytor Lake We met on November 10, 2021. A subcommittee was formed consisting of the permitting and involved agencies that included DCR, AEP, PULASKI County, DEQ, USACE, and Kessler contracting. They will work on the feasibility of using dewatering bags and native vegetation to create habitat and deal with dredge material. The entire committee will meet in January to discuss educating pubic about permitting process. It becomes complex when you have silt that contains metals and other pollutants.

The Smith Mountain Lake Habitat technical Review committee will meet either Thursday or Friday of this week. This is an annual meeting. Smith Mountain Lake gets \$ 25000 from APCO every year as part of the lake management plan. Dan Wilson and a group of nonaffiliated anglers control the placement of the habitat.
